Speaking Project: Exploring Ecuador's Monuments and Natural Attractions

Instructions:

- 1. **Choose a Monument or Natural Attraction:** Each student will select a well-known monument or natural attraction in Ecuador. Some examples:
 - o **Monuments:** The Middle of the World (La Mitad del Mundo), Monument to the Heroes of Independence (Quito).
 - Natural Attractions: Galápagos Islands, Cotopaxi Volcano, Amazon Rainforest, Quilotoa Lagoon.
- 2. **Research the History and Importance:** Students should gather information about the history, significance, and unique features of their chosen place. Encourage them to find interesting facts that will engage their audience.
- 3. Create a Presentation: The presentation should be 3-5 minutes long, using the Past Continuous and Present Perfect tenses to describe events and experiences related to their chosen site. Below are guidelines and examples on how to structure their speech.

Presentation Structure and Language Guidelines:

1. Introduction (Present the Place):

- Past Continuous Example: "While I was visiting La Mitad del Mundo, I learned that it's not just a monument but also a cultural museum." (The action was happening in the past during the visit.)
- **Present Perfect Example**: "Many tourists **have visited La Mitad del Mundo** to stand on the equator, but few know about its significance to ancient civilizations." (The experience of many tourists connects the past to the present.)

2. Historical Background:

• Past Continuous Example:

"When the scientists were calculating the coordinates for La Mitad del Mundo, they realized they were slightly off from the true equator."

(Describes an ongoing action in the past that led to a discovery.)

• Present Perfect Example:

"The monument **has become** one of the most popular landmarks for visitors from around the world."

(The action happened in the past but continues to impact tourism today.)

3. Personal Experience or Observation:

• Past Continuous Example:

"While I was exploring Cotopaxi National Park, I saw wild horses running across the

plains."

(An action in progress during the visit.)

• Present Perfect Example:

"I have never experienced a volcano as active and impressive as Cotopaxi." (An experience that is relevant to the present.)

4. Significance for Tourism:

• Present Perfect Example:

"The Galápagos Islands **have attracted** nature lovers and scientists for decades, making it one of the most important eco-tourism destinations in the world." (Describes the ongoing attraction of the islands to tourists.)

Sample Student Speech:

"Good afternoon everyone! Today, I'll be talking about **the Galápagos Islands**, one of Ecuador's most famous natural attractions. While I was exploring the islands last summer, I noticed how untouched and pristine the environment was, even though thousands of visitors have been coming here for years. The Galápagos Islands **have been recognized** as a UNESCO World Heritage site, and they **have helped** Ecuador become a leader in eco-tourism.

While I was snorkeling near the islands, I saw unique species, like the marine iguana. Many people have heard about Charles Darwin's theory of evolution, which was inspired by his research on the islands. Scientists have been studying the wildlife here for centuries, and they have discovered new species that can't be found anywhere else in the world. Visiting the Galápagos has been one of the most unforgettable experiences of my life."

Final Task:

- **Interaction**: After the presentation, students can ask each other questions using the Past Continuous and Present Perfect.
 - Example: "While you were at La Mitad del Mundo, were there any other attractions you explored nearby?" "Have you ever seen the giant tortoises of the Galápagos in person?"
