INTONATION

Use falling intonation on the last content word of a sentence. Use rising intonation on the last content word of a <u>yes</u> / <u>no</u> question.	
For example:	
I'm SORry to HEAR THAT.	Is there ANYthing WRONG?
A. Read and practice.	
1. I'm HERE on BUSIness.	4. You MUST feel TERrible.
2. I HAVE a TOOTHache.	5. I REALly apPREciate it.
3. ARE you in a LOT of PAIN?	6. Could I COME in the MORning?
Auxiliaries can have falling or rising intonation when they are at the end of a sentence or in a tag question.	
For example: You SPEAK ENGlish, DON'T you?	YES, I DO.
