GRAMMAR. Will be able to; Modals may and might

Look at these examples.

1. The doctor **will be able to see** you tomorrow.
She **won't be able to come** to work this week.

2. The dentist **may/might arrive** at the office a little late this morning.
You **may not/might not need** to come in right away.

3. The doctor **may be able to see** you today.
I **might not be able to get** there till 6:00.
We **must be able to park** here. See the sign?
They **must not be able to cancel** the appointment.
