## INTONATION IN DIRECT AND INDIRECT SPEECH

Use rising intonation on the reporting verbs <u>say</u> and <u>tell</u>; use falling intonation on the last content word in quoted speech.

For example:

Martha TOLD me, / "Be home before the STORM."

Everyone SAYS, / "Get ready for a big storm toMORrow."

Use falling intonation in indirect speech. Stress the last content word.

For example:

He said to be home before MIDnight.

They told her not to be home too LATE.
