## **PROJECT: "Our World City"**

Level: B1 Group size: 3–4 students Final product: A city map on a poster + video presentation

**Project Goal:** You will create an imaginary city that includes famous landmarks and common city features. You will describe your city using **city vocabulary**, **prepositions of place**, and the **present perfect tense with** *already* **and** *yet* in a creative video presentation.

- 1. Form a group of 3 or 4 people.
- 2. Create your own imaginary city by combining:
  - 6 to 8 famous landmarks from around the world
    - (Examples: Statue of Liberty, Eiffel Tower, Pyramids of Egypt, Big Ben, Colosseum, Brooklyn Bridge, etc.)
    - **Other city features** using the vocabulary from class (Examples: bridge, tunnel, bike lane, fountain, tower, avenue, etc.)
- 3. Give your city a creative name.
  - Be original, futuristic, funny, or imaginative!
- 4. Draw a detailed map of your city on a poster:
  - Label streets, neighborhoods, landmarks, and city features
  - Organize the map clearly
  - Use **prepositions of place** (e.g., next to, behind, between, across from, in front of) to describe where things are located
- 5. Add extra details about each landmark when presenting.

Example:

- The Eiffel Tower is in the city center. It was built in 1889 and attracts millions of visitors every year.
- The Pyramids are behind the stadium. They're more than 4,000 years old and made of limestone blocks.
- 6. Use the Present Perfect with *already* and *yet* while describing your poster in the video.
  - Each student must say at least one sentence using this grammar.
  - You should use at least four present perfect sentences in total.
  - Use it to talk about:
    - What features or landmarks **you've already added** to your city
    - What features or ideas you haven't added yet
  - Examples to use in your video:
    - We've already placed the Eiffel Tower in the center of our city.
    - We've already built a bike lane that goes across the entire city.
    - We haven't added the Statue of Liberty yet, but we're planning to put it near the river.
    - We haven't finished labeling all the neighborhoods yet.

## 7. Record your video presentation (4–6 minutes):

- Show your **poster**
- All group members must speak
- Describe the layout of your city, landmarks, and locations
- Use prepositions of place
- Include **extra details** about the landmarks
- Use the **present perfect with** *already* **and** *yet* as explained above
- 8. Submit your video to the virtual classroom.
