Examples:

- will have been living
- will have been working
- will have been studying

- 3.- We use the **Future Perfect Continuous** to talk about actions that:

Start **before** a specific time in the future

Continue until that future time

Show how long the action has been happening

Examples:

- By 2026, I will have been studying at university for four years.
- At 10 p.m., she will have been working all day.
