
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
ROBERT VENTURI (1925-2018)


He was born in 1925 in Philadelphia, Robert Venturi was an American (originally Italian) architect. He is also was a writer, a teacher, an artist and a philosopher.

Venturi graduated from Princeton University in 1947 and received his Master of Fine Art degree. Lately, he taught an architectural theory course at the University of Pennsylvania, School of Architecture. After, he has lectured at numerous institutions including Yale, Harvard, University of California and the American Academy in Rome. Before he founded his own office in 1958 he worked with Louis Kahn and Eero Saarinen.

He was known to be founder of postmodernism.

Venturi wrote many texts including Complexity and Contradiction in Architecture, and Learning from Las Vegas (with Scott Brown), which challenged many of the principles of modern architecture, and later became the pioneer of birth of the postmodern era in the second half of the 20th century.
